Autumn 2025



The past three months have been remarkable for our city, marked by significant infrastructure achievements, a lively events calendar and the unveiling of the plaque for winning the AR Bluett Memorial Award.

We celebrated the grand reopening of the \$52 million Hunter Sports
Centre expansion at Glendale, Kaiyu
Nungkiliko, the \$14 million Belmont
Sports Complex redevelopment and the \$11.86 million completion of three new bridges in Martinsville. These projects are crucial for our city's future.

The expanded Hunter Sports Centre, with \$28 million from Lake Macquarie City Council and grants from State and Federal governments, will attract major sporting events and nurture local talent through our partnership with the University of Newcastle.

The start of autumn also saw us celebrate a \$14 million upgrade to Belmont's sporting facilities, including major renovations to Barton Field and Lumsden Oval. These upgrades added four rectangular fields, a baseball diamond and cricket wicket improvements, catering to various sporting clubs.

As part of the Belmont sporting facilities upgrades, the Molly Smith Netball Courts received a \$3 million

refresh, funded on a 50-50 partnership basis by the NSW Government and Council. Upgrades included resurfacing all 14 courts, new lighting, line marking and goal posts.

Our vision for Belmont Sports Complex is to establish it as a regional team sporting hub capable of hosting state championships and acting as a domestic tourism magnet for Lake Macquarie. To achieve this, we need continued support from both the Federal and NSW Governments. In baseball terms, we are on first base but need their support for a home run.

In the West ward, two bridges on Owens Road and one on Pointers Road were replaced to meet modern standards and load limits, improving access for about 50 semi-rural properties.

I'd also like to congratulate our new Lake Mac Ambassador Dr Alyce Barnes who won the top honour for promoting sports and physical activity, as well as Emma Walsh, who was named Young Citizen of the Year for her fundraising efforts. A special thank you to our outgoing ambassador, Matt Hall, and Young Citizen of the Year, Sophie Berude, for their hard work and dedication to our city.

THE HUNTER SPORTS CENTRE, Kaiyu Nungkiliko, IS NOW OPEN

The \$52 million Hunter Sports Centre, Kaiyu Nungkiliko expansion has crossed the finish line, delivering a world-class athletics centre and Australian-first Trampoline Centre of Excellence for the Hunter Region.

The multi-level sport and community centre, with community and function rooms, a health and fitness centre, offices and cafe is a haven for children, athletes, sports enthusiasts and adults looking to maintain a healthy lifestyle.

The new Trampoline Centre of Excellence at the western end of the site includes a 1300m² trampoline hall with ten trampolines, two tumbling strips, warm-up areas and grandstand seating for 400.

From children's programs to a 24-7 fitness gym, the new space offers something for all ages and abilities.
